Starehe turns 51 years and counting

The 51st Anniversary of Starehe's founding was celebrated on 17th July at the Boys' Centre, with inspiring speeches from the Director and musical performances by students. An impressive attendance by staff, students and alumni marked this very important annual event, along with a number of friends and admirers of Starehe who came along to celebrate – those present numbered more than 2,000 in total!

As we look back on the progress Starehe has made during the 51 years since its founding, we also look forward to the year ahead, which promises the completion of a number of exciting infrastructure projects, such as the renovation of the music building at Starehe Boys' Centre, kindly funded by the Umbrella Tree Trust, and the completion of a bore hole at Starehe Girls' Centre. Such significant improvements to the day-to-day running of both Centres will allow the schools to continue to fulfil their own potential – and that of their students – for years to come.

Ex-Shell staff celebrate fundraising success at Shell Centre

On 30th June StareheFuture was given the opportunity to hold a drinks reception at Shell Centre to thank a group of ex-Shell staff members for their marvellous efforts in fundraising for Starehe. The 'Jambo Starehe' Consortium, organised by Glyn Halliday, is made up of former Shell employees, many of whom were previously based in Kenya or East Africa. The consortium members raised a fantastic £16,000 among them, which will endow one place at Starehe Girls' Centre in perpetuity. Sir Bob Reid, former Chairman of Shell UK and a committed supporter of StareheFuture, thanked those gathered on behalf of Shell and Starehe, and expressed his delight at how much had been raised.

Royal visit at State House for President's Award Prize Giving ceremony

In September 39 SBC students attended State House, the President's official residence, for the President's Award prize giving ceremony. This, Kenya's equivalent to the Duke of Edinburgh's Award, presents young people with Gold, Silver and Bronze Awards for the successful completion of orienteering, survival and conservation challenges, with the aim of equipping 14-25 year olds with life skills that go beyond the academic realm.

Prince Edward, The Earl of Wessex, was present at State House for the Awards ceremony and, in his capacity as Chair of the International Awards Council, expressed his admiration for those who had taken part. President Kibaki, as Patron of the President's Award, presented the high-achieving youngsters with their Awards.

SBC has excelled in the President's Award, consistently winning more Gold Awards than any other participating school, and SGC aims to match this success by running an extremely active and popular President's Award scheme of their own. Our congratulations go to all those Stareheans celebrating their recent success!
