**Starehe Boys' Centre students reporting for the BBC**  
**Starehe Boys' tell the world how they revive the art of letter-writing.**



Students at Starehe Boys' Centre captured the imagination of BBC News readers when their report on the role of letter writing at the Centre was featured as part of the BBC's School Report News Day on 19th March 2015.

The students filmed their report based on the love of letter-writing as a way of communicating with friends in other schools due to student mobile phones not being allowed at the Centre.

Whereas other children may use texting as their choice of communication with friends, at Starehe Boys' the students have revived the art of letter-writing, calligraphy and love letters

The Boys' report has stirred international interest. Amongst the supportive responses, one from Canada particularly captures why the act of writing letters is such an emotive topic:

"We find this very refreshing. Making use of technology by means of texting is a wonderful way of instantly reaching others. However, although it is an immediate way of connecting with others, it does not lend itself to a great deal of reflection... Texting cannot replace letter-writing as a caring, sympathetic, mediative, introspective way of sharing thoughts and feelings with friends. Bravo for Starehe!"

### **2014 Exam success**

**Great results for the schools in the KCSE examination results.**



On 3<sup>rd</sup> March 2015 the Kenya Certificate of Secondary Education Examination results for 2014 were released with students from the Boys' Centre receiving great grades. The results revealed that the boys achieved a mean score of 10.65 out of the possible 12 points. As a result nearly all students achieved the grades to enter into University programmes.

His Excellency Mwai Kibaki, the third President of Kenya wrote to congratulate the staff and students on their results. He remarked that the performance is a clear demonstration of the resolve to ensure Starehe Boys' Centre remains a hub of excellence in modelling responsible and progressive young Kenyans.

Amongst the achievements, 6 students have won scholarships for universities and gap-year programmes overseas. These include at Stanford University, St Andrews College and University School in the USA. Armidale University in Australia, Regent School in Pattaya Thailand and Aiglon College in Switzerland.
