The 16th of July marked the 52nd anniversary since the opening of the Starehe Boys' Centre by Mr Joseph Gikubu, the late Dr Geoffrey Griffin and Mr Geoffrey Gethuro. The guest of honour at Founders Day this year was Professor George Magoha, eminent urologist, Vice Chancellor of the University of Nairobi and Starehe alumnus.

Some notable achievements over the last year include 3 Starehe Boys' Centre students emerged first in the Kenya Youth Chess Championships in the under 14, under 16 and under 18 categories. They will represent Kenya and Starehe at the World Youth Chess Championships in Brazil later this year.

Due to their academic excellence Starehe Boys' Centre graduates have received 13 full university scholarships to top American universities, including Harvard, Yale, Princeton and Howard.
